

Bill Bolles

Inducted in 1989

Bill began his coaching career in 1968 and coached at the following Wyoming Schools:

1968-1969 Riverton High School (Riverton, Wyoming)

1969-2010 Kelly Walsh High School (Casper, Wyoming)

On the date of his induction, he was still coaching and his career encompassed 21 years of experience. In total, his coaching career encompassed 42 years.

Noted for his success in cross-country, Bill had an overall record of 5 regional championships, 1 state runner-up title and 4 state championships.

During his coaching career, Bill achieved the following:

Assisted 9 state championships: 1 in football, 4 in basketball, and 4 in track.

Selected as Wyoming Coaches Association Cross-Country Coach of the Year—1976.

State 4A Track Runner-up in 1987.

From 1996-2004, Bill was head coach for Girls' Basketball. His teams finished 2nd once, 3rd twice, and 4th once.

Bill was selected Conference Track Coach of the Year in 1992.

He was also the Wyoming Coaches Association Track Coach of the Year in 1992, 1998, and 1999.

He was selected Conference Coach of the year in Girls' Basketball in 1998.

Bill founded the Wyoming Track Coaches' Association along with several other track coaches. He served as the organization's Executive Secretary until his retirement in 2010

From 1993 to 2010, he also served as the Wyoming High School Activities Association Rules' Interpreter for track and field.

In 2013, Bill received the Wyoming Coaches' Association Bill Farthing Award.

In 2015, Bill was selected to the National Coaches Association Hall of Fame.
