"BUD" BEGAN HIS COACHING CAREER IN 1948 AND COACHED AT THE FOLLOWING WYOMING SCHOOLS:

HIS COACHING CAREER CONCLUDED IN 1971 WITH A TOTAL OF 23 YEARS EXPERIENCE.

NOTED FOR HIS COACHING SUCCESS IN BASEBALL, "BUD" HAD AN OVERALL RECORD OF 362 WINS AND 348 LOSSES, INCLUDING 5 WESTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIPS, 1 NATIONAL COLLLEGIATE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP, AND 1 COLLEGE WORLD SERIES TOURNAMENT.
