



GLENN "RED" JACOBY
INDUCTED IN 1984

"RED" BEGAN HIS CAREER AS ATHLETIC DIRECTOR IN 1946 AND DEVOTED HIS 27 YEARS EXPERIENCE TO SERVING THE UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING. HIS CAREER ENDED IN 1973.

"RED" WAS CREDITED FOR THE REBIRTH OF COWBOY ATHLETICS. HE ALSO WAS CHIEFLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DETAILED PLANNING OF THE WYOMING MEMORIAL FIELDHOUSE AND STADIUM. IN A TRIBUTE TO "RED", THE UNIVERSITY GOLF COURSE WAS GIVEN HIS NAME.

"RED'S" GUIDANCE OF THE ATHLETIC PROGRAMS AT THE UNIVERSITY WAS CAPPED IN 1968 BY THE COWBOYS' 5TH BOWL DATE, THE SUGAR BOWL IN NEW ORLEANS. HE DIRECTED A SERIES OF COACHES WHO BECAME HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL AND EARNED NATIONAL REPUTATIONS.

ON FEBRUARY 21, 1972, "RED" WAS INDUCTED INTO THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF ATHLETIC DIRECTORS HALL OF FAME.
