LLOYD BEGAN HIS COACHING CAREER IN 1940 AND COACHED AT THE FOLLOWING SCHOOLS:

1940 - 1941 BLACK HILLS STATE COLLEGE (SPEARFISH, SOUTH DAKOTA)
1941 - 1942 DUPREE HIGH SCHOOL (DUPREE, SOUTH DAKOTA)
1945 - 1948 MARTIN HIGH SCHOOL (MARTIN, SOUTH DAKODA)
1948 - 1949 UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN (ANN ARBOR, MICHIGAN)
1949 - 1956 ALMA COLLEGE (ALMA, MICHIGAN)
1956 - 1957 NORTHERN MICHIGAN COLLEGE (MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN)
1957 - 1971 UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING (LARAMIE, WYOMING)

HIS COACHING CAREER CONCLUDED IN 1971 WITH A TOTAL OF 28 YEARS EXPERIENCE. LLOYD THEN SERVED AS THE ASSISTANT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR AT THE UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING FROM 1971-1972.

NOTED FOR HIS SUCCESS IN FOOTBALL, LLOYD HAD AN OVERALL RECORD OF 104 WINS, 53 LOSSES, AND 5 TIES, INCLUDING 3 WESTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS, AND 2 BOWL BIDS (SUN BOWL- 1966, SUGAR BOWL - 1968).
