

WILLIAM T. McINTOSH INDUCTED IN 1990 (Plaque #85)

"BILL" BEGAN HIS COACHING CAREER IN 1961 AND COACHED AT THE FOLLOWING SCHOOLS:

1961 - 1966 SEAFORD HIGH SCHOOL (SEAFORD, DELAWARE) 1966 - 1994 JACKSON HOLE HIGH SCHOOL (JACKSON, WYOMING)

HIS COACHING CAREER CONCLUDED IN 1994 WITH 33 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE. STARTING IN 1974 HE ALSO DOUBLED AS THE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR IN JACKSON.

NOTED FOR HIS SUCCESS AS AN ATHLETIC DIRECTOR, "BILL" HAS SEEN JACKSON HOLE HIGH SCHOOL TEAMS EARN MORE THAN 35 STATE AND REGIONAL TITLES.

DURING HIS COACHING CAREER, "BILL" ACHIEVED THE FOLLOWING:

- INITIATED GIRLS BASKETBALL AS A VOLUNTEER IN 1973. JACKSON TEAMS ATTENDED STATE TOURNAMENTS 11 OF 13 YEARS DURING THAT TIME.
- SERVED AS BOTH HEAD AND ASSISTANT COACH WHERE NEEDED IN FOOTBALL, BOYS AND GIRLS BASKETBALL, AND BASEBALL.
- HIS COACHING CAREER BEGAN IN 1967 IN JACKSON AS THE NINTH GRADE BASKETBALL COACH AND HE CONTINUED TO COACH FOOTBALL AND BOYS AND GIRLS BASKETBALL FOR THE NEXT 27 YEARS AND ALSO SERVE AS ALTHETIC DIRECTOR.
- IN 1973, HE VOLUNTARILY INITIATED GIRLS BASKETBALL AND WAS HEAD COACH FOR EIGHT YEARS. IN 1990 HE REASSUMED THE HEAD COACHING POSITION AND IN 1991 WON THE STATE TITLE IN GIRLS BASKETBALL AND WAS SELECTED 3A BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR.

IN 2001, THE TETON COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT HONORED BILL BY NAMING ITS STADIUM "WILLIAM T. McINTOSH STADIUM," THE HIGHLIGHT OF HIS CAREER.
